COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (240K FUNDING PER ANNUM DCJ UNTIL EFY 25)

- In Between Time saw 310 children, parents and carers attend over 10 weeks.
- 1608 people visited the Centre for information, drop-in lounge, bread and food.
- We gave out 1,435 food bags.
- Our monthly Town Square stalls engaged with 279 locals.
- The International Women's Day event had 120 attendees.
- Manners Park Xmas Tree Decorating event had 72 children
- The Blue Fringe Festival had 680 people attending.



RESILIENCE & RECOVERY PROJECT COMPLETION JAN '24

- In May 2023 the focus of community engagement was to create draft bushfire plans with the approval and engagement of the RFS.
- 42 events offered or held. Events included both face-to-face and virtual.
- Events held in 22 villages.
- Almost 100 draft bushfire plans created.
 Approximately 130 participants engaged.
- Property preparation service 35 expressions of interest received. 33 properties were eligible & serviced.
- Completed included P-CEP & Gender disaster training.
- Project report created and submitted along with final project acquittal end January 2024.

Report on the Financial Report

I have audited the accompanying financial report of Springwood Neighbourhood Centre Co-operative Limited, being a special purpose financial report, which comprises the Statement by Members of the Committee, the Statement of Comprehensive Income, the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Accounting Policies and explanatory notes for the financial year ended 30 June 2024.

Board of Management's Responsibility for the Financial Report
